# Prepared4ALL: Whole Community Inclusive Emergency Planning RESOURCES

### Prepared4ALL Approach

<u>Prepared4ALL</u> - An initiative that aims to mobilize disability organizations and their networks to foster connections with emergency and public health professionals to build trust, create sustainable relationships, and get a seat at the emergency planning table.

<u>Public Health is for Everyone Toolkit</u> - Online toolkit that serves as a one-stop resource to increase capacity of public health professionals to create programs that benefit entire communities, including people who have disabilities.

<u>National Preparedness Month</u> - Every September is National Preparedness Month. Materials, templates, and messaging are available to support your local outreach.

<u>Project Civic Access</u> - Ensures that counties, cities, towns, and villages comply with the ADA by eliminating physical and communication barriers that prevent people with disabilities from participating fully in community life.

<u>Same Time Access To Everyone (STATE)</u> - A communication standard developed by the University of Montana Rural Institute for Inclusive Communities (MT's UCEDD) to share accessible information at the same time for everyone, regardless of how they might communicate, so that there is *Same Time Access to Everyone (STATE)*.
