- Purpose of training: to provide training and support to early care providers who serve children (aged birth to five years) who have neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS), fetal alcohol spectrum disorder (FASD), or are affected by other substance use disorders, and their families.
- Invited participants: early care providers across KY who serve children with NAS, FASD, and their families
- Funded by the Human Development Institute at UK

- Each session includes a 20 minute expert presentation on the topic, presentation of a child challenge (from the experience of participants), and small group interactive discussions of possible strategies related to the topic. An electronic discussion board will continue discussions at participants' convenience.
- The series is designed for participants to **attend all 9 sessions**, as we will be developing a community of practice to support each other in serving children with NAS, FASD, and their families. We'll have fun incentives for participation after each session and at the end of the series! Please do not register if you can not attend the majority of sessions.
