


Summary from March 10: Carol Cecil and Barb Greene, KY Partnership for Families and Children

Main takeaways:

- Asking open-ended questions encourages people to talk more about their experiences and world view (ex: What would you like your life to look like a year from now?)
- Strength-based interactions foster hope, empower people, and encourage people to take back the control over their lives.
- ▶ The same values can look very different from person to person.
- How do you honor someone else's values?







Case Presentation, March 10: "John"

Strengths:

- Mom is working to reunify with John
- ▶ John is being cared for by family (mom's sister)

Barriers:

- Mom has bipolar disorder and takes medication sporadically
- Due to early trauma, John and his aunt have challenges connecting
- Mom and aunt have strained relationship currently


Needs:

► Therapy for trauma, sensory integration and auditory processing issues

Case Presentation, March 10: "John"

Strategies:

- Ask open-ended questions to mediate a conversation on values between John's aunt and mom
- Therapy for John, aunt, and mom (family and individual)
- Connected Parenting course for mom and aunt
- Head Start preschool program
- Peer support or mental health support group for mom
